In 1910 I passed the Texas state bar—
the first female to do so.

"Women are made from a rib; they're just chattel."

My bill, passed in 1913, guaranteed Texas' married women separate property.

"She's too pushy and forward."

I was the first woman admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court.

"She goes against what God intended women to do."

I stood in the streets of Houston championing women's right to vote.

"Sorry, no time to study your candidates, I need to willow the plumes on my hat."

I was first in line to register to vote in Harris County.

"I'm not gonna nursemaid a woman judge."

The court clerk left in a huff when I was appointed Chief Justice of the Texas Supreme Court.

Now, they call me "Liberty's woman."
